

## Messaging Memo for Leaders: Pornography as a Public Health Crisis

## Speak from a position of strength.

**Strong Statements Include:** 

- This is based on peer-reviewed research.
- Once people hear the research, they realize pornography is contributing to neurological, psychological, and sociological harms on a massive scale.
- Porn decreases brain matter in areas of decision-making and motivation, it is hardly harmless.
- Tobacco used to be considered harmless, but the research eventually revealed quite the opposite, and we are seeing the same narrative beginning with pornography.
- Research shows that pornography is significantly linked to increases in sexual violence and aggression. It is therefore incompatible with a society that strives to embrace equality and respect between the sexes.
- Thanks to the Internet, pornography is so pervasive that it is shaping the sexual templates of many children even before they reach puberty.

Focus always on the positive, what we do know, and how it is reliably based on science and peer-reviewed research.

## Refrain from weak statements.

Weak Statements Include:

- We are not prudes/anti-sex.
- This is not based on religious views.
- Pornography is "evil."
- We're not crazy/extreme.
- We're not anti-free speech.
- We're not pro-censorship.

Never state what we are NOT, but rather focus on asserting the positive. What we do know, and how it is reliable. Statements like "I am not guilty" are easily quoted, and can often give the opposite of the desired effect.

Often questions may be posted in a manner that begs you to give a weak answer, but use transition sentences to get your messaging back on track.

**Transition Sentences Include:** 

- That is a common misperception, the truth is that...
- Actually, obscenity (or hardcore pornography) is not protected under the 1<sup>st</sup> Amendment. This demonstrates the wisdom of our courts, because the harms of pornography are...
- Individuals of all backgrounds can recognize the detrimental effects pornography is having...
