NOTICE ON MOTION TO THE ACP PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY HON. ASHEMS SONGWE, MP HEAD OF MALAWIAN DELEGATION TO ACP-EU JPA

Resolution Ensuring Parliaments Are Able to Hold Appropriate National Consultations Before Ratification of the New Post-Cotonou Agreement

Recalling that the ACP-EU Agreement commits the Parties to good governance and the principles of rule of law as one of its main objectives (Article 1.3.a);

Acknowledging that, as one of the Agreement's key principles, the Parties "shall promote a multi-stakeholder approach, enabling the active engagement of a wide variety of actors in partnership dialogue and cooperation processes, including parliaments...." (Article 2.8);

Emphasizing that the Parties "agree that parliaments ... shall be duly informed, consulted and enabled to feed into the partnership dialogue," and enable comprehensive dialogue "on all areas of [the] Agreement, leading to commitments, and where appropriate, actions on both sides, for [its] effective implementation...." (Article 3.1 & .4);

Given that the Agreement is very broad in scope and requires the Parties to amend their national constitutions or enact appropriate legislation where needed to conform with commitments made as a result of the Agreement's provisions, for instance on "the principle of gender equality" (Article 10.1);

Reaffirming that national parliaments are the rightful legislative and policy-making bodies for their countries representing the voice of their

constituencies, are generally responsible to enact legislation, and have a vote in amending their national constitutions;

Therefore, be it resolved that:

- 1. All Joint Parliamentary Assembly (JPA) members, who also are members of their national policy-making bodies, shall receive the full and current text of the draft ACP-EU Agreement from the European Commission and OACPS secretariat upon immediate effect of this resolution;
- 2. The European Commission and OACPS secretariat shall send a note to Heads of State of OACPS and EU countries requesting that they take no formal action related to signing the Agreement until their parliaments have concluded their national consultations.
- 3. ACP-EU JPA members shall be granted a period of six months to hold appropriate consultations with their respective national parliaments on the Agreement's provisions;
- 4. The next Joint Parliamentary Assembly meeting shall have an assigned plenary session for JPA members to report on the results of the consultations with their respective parliaments.
